

Still Beating by Jennifer Hartmann is a gripping, heart-pounding tale that effortlessly blends suspense, humor, and a slow-burn romance. From the very first page, readers are pulled into Cora and Dean's intense dynamic, where years of teasing and rivalry explode into a life-or-death situation. Trapped together in a madman's basement, they must rely on each other in ways neither of them could ever have predicted.

Jennifer masterfully crafts a story full of tension, unexpected twists, and emotional depth. The evolution of Cora and Dean's relationship is captivating as the lines between hate and love blur, making every moment of their journey feel earned and genuine. The chemistry between the two characters is electric, and their growth as individuals and as a pair is profoundly moving.
