Children's Programming Highlights

May marked the final month of the school year and it was packed with activity! We welcomed 76 students from Nathan Hale and St. John schools for class visits. During their time at the library, we shared stories, introduced them to our Summer Reading Program, and sent them home with materials highlighting everything the library has to offer—especially our upcoming family-friendly summer events.

As the school year wrapped up, we concluded many of our regular after-school programs, including Gutsy Gourmet, LEGO Club, Barbie Club, and Wheelie Wednesday. These programs will return in the fall as we shift gears to focus on special summer programming.

Some of our most popular programs this month included:

- Tween/Teen Makers: Participants created their own lip balm and essential oil blends.
- Gutsy Gourmet: We held a spicy food and candy taste test that was a hit!
- Creativity Club: This month's Creativity Club was especially well-attended as kids made homemade sidewalk chalk.

On May 10th, I was invited to represent the library at the Whiting-Robertsdale Plant Swap at the Wolf Lake Greenhouse. I promoted the Summer Reading Program and offered a hands-on craft project for children. The event was well-attended and a great outreach opportunity.

We also launched a brand-new monthly program in May: **Family STEAM Squad**, which will meet every fourth Tuesday at 6:00 p.m. This month's activity had families creating light-up greeting cards using paper circuitry (copper tape, batteries, and LED bulbs). This program is part of a broader effort to refresh and expand our offerings to better engage *families* in the library.

Summer Reading sign-ups opened on May 19th, and we already have 75 children and teens registered as of May 30th. The program officially begins on June 2nd, and our **Summer Reading Kick-Off Party** is set for Saturday, June 7th. The event will feature summer reading sign-ups, music, face painting (courtesy of a discounted service by C&C Creatives), food (generously donated by The Hot Dog Guy), snow cones, yard games, and a bubble station.
